Greetings All! As we approach the end of another successful year for the Drifters it is time to look back on the last year and to see if there is anything we can learn from this year. A new SWAMBC secretary with lots of model boating experience has taken over from Dave, he is Will Hickman (yes a Drifters and Yate and Sodbury MBC member), according to Will his family, including his Wife and Son, Mum and Father-in-law are into model boating, looks as if they could start a club on their own! "Good Luck Will".

Exeter and District MBC over the next 6 months they will be concentrating on IOM and R10r yacht racing, they had a scale day teaming up with Tone Valley with a packed programme of events, but the main reason was a good old simple get-together for scale boating. **City of Plymouth** had a fairly successful year and celebrated their 30 years (that's some record) one of their mishaps, that could and probably have happened to other clubs, is their "gazebo" blew down in a gust of wind and damaged some models, fortunately not terminally. **Falmouth MBC** has been really active visiting a number of venues, one of their latest models built by Wilf Burrows is a eight and half foot working model of RMS Queen Mary a superb model, lets hope they can get it to Weymouth for all to see. **Poole Radio Yacht Club** after a busy year and visiting Weymouth their Scale Day finished on a high note on October 20th with wall to wall sunshine and a good breeze for the yachts, whilst calm at the club house end for scale sailing.

Solent Radio Control Model Yacht Club. What a busy year they have had, Marwell Zoo, Calshot and Lymington Lifeboat Days with the Southern Model Lifeboat Society joining in (*not heard of them before?*), The Solent Trophy, Romsey Model World, once again they have produced their own club calendar at £7, lets hope they find members to buy them! I see their Christmas dinner is £20.50 a head, WOW!!! **Weymouth and Potland MBC** the weed on their lake at Kingston Marwell is slowly disappearing, and the water has been low at Radipole Lake, though most clubs have been lucky this year. They have also had some very good speakers including one on "unmanned surface vessels" used for surveillance work and military activities. **Yeovil and District Model Boat Club Ltd.** Another club's water unfortunately affected by weed. They also hosted round six of the "fast electrics" at Sutton Bingham where it was the wettest and windiest of the year, but the die-hards carried on and some good racing ensued. They also attended the SWAMBC AGM and the report by them was the excellent coffee and hot dogs! **Yeovil Model Warship Association** have had a successful year, with an "open day" and a "warships Day", expected to be repeated in 2008. For the steering competitions they now have three classes: Pilot, Intermediate and Expert with promotions and demonstrations from each grade.
